Cobalt's vision is to pioneer innovation in medical imaging diagnosis by investing in equipment, integrated research and education, to improve outcomes for patients now and in the future. The Charity has been established since 1964. Last year we provided diagnostic imaging for over 115,000 patients through imaging centres in Cheltenham and Birmingham and through a fleet of mobile Magnetic Resonance Imaging (MRI), CT and Positron Emission Tomography/Computerised Tomography (PET/CT) scanners, supporting NHS hospitals across the UK.

DONATE TODAY AND MAKE A DIFFERENCE



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We are pleased to have achieved our fundraising target of £303,000 to be able to install a new, state-of-the-art digital PET/CT (Positron Emission Tomography / Computerised Tomography) scanner at our Imaging Centre in Cheltenham at a cost of £2m.

Cobalt provides the NHS PET/CT service for Gloucestershire, Herefordshire and Worcestershire and this new digital scanner, one of only three in the UK, will enable Cobalt to provide very high quality images with shorter scan times. As the demand for PET/CT scans

continues to increase, the new scanner will provide more capacity to ensure that patients are seen quickly and can receive an earlier diagnosis.

Roisin Dobbin-Stacey, Head of CT and PET/CT, said 'The new scanner gives us the ability to use the very latest technology, enhancing our ability to support a wider range of research into the early diagnosis and treatment of cancer and dementia. We are so grateful for all the support we have been given to fund this new scanner'.



PET/CT scans combine the information from a PET scan and a CT scan into one single examination that helps doctors make an early diagnosis. The patient is given a small dose of a radioisotope, which usually contains glucose. Cancer cells are more metabolically active and may absorb glucose at a higher rate, these cells can therefore be identified on the scan. This helps in the diagnosis of cancer and dementia, but also in assessing how well the cancer treatment is working, i.e. radiotherapy or chemotherapy. The patient may return for a number of scans.

To accommodate the new scanner, the PET/CT department has had to be extended to include more patient 'uptake rooms'. Once the patient has had an injection of the radioisotope, they relax for up to an hour in an uptake room. As radioisotopes are used, these rooms have lead lining on the walls and the ceilings. However, they are very comfortable rooms with an armchair, TV and radio to help the patient relax.

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### **GLOUCESTERSHIRE ROYAL HOSPITAL**



Cobalt is supporting the local NHS by providing an imaging centre at Gloucestershire Royal Hospital. This new centre, with the latest CT and MRI scanners, supports both patients from the hospital and wider community.

NHS England are planning to develop over 150 community diagnostic centres, so patients can have their imaging closer to home. Cobalt is working with the NHS to develop a centre in Gloucestershire in 2023. The Cobalt Imaging Centre in Cheltenham has been providing a full range of medical imaging in the community since 2006, supporting the NHS.

# IMPROVING PATIENT CARE: NEW CT INJECTOR TECHNOLOGY

Cobalt has always worked with medical equipment suppliers like Philips and Siemens, to introduce the latest technology. We are delighted to be the first mobile CT scanning provider in the UK to install the new Medrad Centargo, a CT scanning contrast media injector.

About 90% of patients having a CT will have an injection of contrast; this shows the blood supply within the body. The contrast injector is a very important device, as it has to deliver the right amount of contrast, at the right time safely. This new system helps automate an existing manual process allowing clinical staff to spend more

time with the patients and reducing plastic waste.

## UPDATE ON LUNG SCREENING

Working in partnership with the NHS, Cobalt is the largest provider of lung cancer screening using ultra-low dose CT scanning in the community. Lung cancer screening, or lung health checks as they are known, have been so successful in identifying early lung cancer. The National Screening Committee is now considering rolling out lung health checks as a national screening service.

On average, each lung health check service will identify one cancer per day, of which 80% will be early-stage treatable cancers. The service also identifies other incidental cancers, which can therefore be treated early.

Cobalt started by supporting the Manchester service in 2019, now the Charity supports services in Newcastle, Gateshead, Hull, Tameside, Glossop, Bradford, Wakefield, Luton, Thurrock, Southend and services in Surrey for the Royal Brompton Hospital. In September this year, Cobalt will also provide a lung health check service in Liverpool, and in 2023 Leeds.

Manchester, Leeds, Liverpool and the Royal Brompton were very much early pioneers of the lung health check programme; Cobalt is delighted to be collaborating with the NHS in all four of these key areas.



# COBALT FUND A NEW CLINICAL FELLOW AT THE ROYAL BROMPTON HOSPITAL

We are pleased to announce that Dr Syed Rahman has been appointed as the Cobalt Lung Intervention Clinical Fellow at The Royal Brompton Hospital. Cobalt provides the ultra-low dose CT service to support the Royal Brompton and Royal Marsden Partners Lung Health Check Programme. The Royal Brompton is also a key centre supporting lung health check programmes with follow-up and surgical cases.

The clinical fellow will develop a number of research projects in lung cancer and teaching materials to aid other centres. By supporting the post the Charity

will be helping to improve the 'patient pathway' from diagnosis, to supporting vital research leading to effective treatments.

Royal Brompton and Harefield hospitals make up the largest specialist heart and lung centre in the UK and among the largest in Europe. The Royal Brompton has pioneered referral services to offer the fast-track lung cancer and "straight to biopsy" approach recommended by the NHS. They have a strong record of research in lung cancer, in partnership with the National Heart and Lung Institute and we are proud to be working with them.

# UPDATE ON THE WORK OF BREAST CANCER RESEARCH NURSES

Cobalt has supported breast cancer services in Gloucestershire since the screening programme launched in 1990. We provide the accommodation for the Thirlestaine Breast Centre in Cheltenham, which is run by Gloucestershire Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust. Over 28,000 screening

mammograms are taken each year and up to 125 symptomatic patients are seen each week at the centre. We also fund two breast cancer research nurse specialists working for the NHS. These nurses recruit patients into research projects and clinical trials to improve the early and accurate diagnosis of breast cancer and identify new treatments.

Breast cancer is the most common type of cancer in the UK. About one in eight women are diagnosed during their lifetime. One of the research projects is called the BRAID trial. This trial looks at the ability of techniques like MRI to diagnose breast cancer in healthy women undergoing routine breast screening.

The centre currently has over 650 women enrolled in the study locally and is the second highest recruiting site in the UK. The funded research posts have allowed patients and clinicians the chance to be involved in research locally which was not available before. The breast cancer research trials take place under the direction of Professor lain Lyburn, Dr Sarah Vinnicombe and Dr Dan Nelmes who lead an experienced research team.

Patients actually like trials. Some people think if you have a patient that has just received a diagnosis of cancer then you can't ask them about trials but the evidence refutes that and patients can always say no, however 98% of people want to be involved and the Cobalt research nurses allow us to ask for the first time in our county.'

## **Banana and Ginger Cake recipe**

#### Treat yourself to some autumn spice

#### Ingredients

115g butter or soft margarine 2 tbsp golden syrup

85g caster sugar

85g soft brown sugar

1 egg

2 ripe bananas, mashed

225g self raising flour

1/2 tsp bicarbonate of soda

2 tsp ground ginger

A pinch of cinnamon

1 tbsp milk

#### Method

- 1. Beat the butter, golden syrup and sugar together
- 2. Add the egg
- 3. Beat in the mashed banana
- 4. Sift together the flour, bicarb, cinnamon and ginger and mix into the other ingredients half at a time
- 5. Stir in the milk and scrape the mixture into a lined 20cm tin or a 1lb loaf tin
- 6. Bake at gas mk 4/180°C (160°C fan oven) for 45 mins or until an inserted cake tester comes out clean.
- 7. Leave to cool before turning out of the tin

This cake is good with lemon icing, or just plain water icing and is a great way to use up the bananas that are left in the fruit bowl for a bit too long!
