COBALT IS CELEBRATING ITS 60TH ANNIVERSARY THIS YEAR!

In 1964 Dr Fred Hanna, Howard Crooks and a committee of medics established the Cobalt Unit Appeal Fund, to raise money to build a centre for cancer treatment in Cheltenham. The unit would benefit local patients who were having to travel long distances when they felt most unwell.

Two years later the Cobalt Unit was established (now known as the Oncology Centre) at Cheltenham General Hospital.

From humble beginnings in a small room within the Cobalt Unit, they continued to raise funds for other innovative equipment and buildings to assist the local NHS to support patients more efficiently and effectively. Fundraising projects included an appeal for a whole body X-ray scanner and a public cancer and smoking cessation awareness campaign. In 1989 the charity established the Gloucestershire breast screening service at Linton House, a property purchased from Cheltenham College.

Linton House then became the charity headquarters and investment was made into several mobile MRI scanning and mammography screening units. The charity's reach extended into the three counties, Gloucestershire, Herefordshire and Worcestershire. In 2005 building work began

on a new Imaging Centre adjacent to Linton House and was completed the following year. Cobalt acquired another building in 2018 which accommodates the local NHS breast screening service. Today, the Cobalt Imaging Centre houses two high-spec MRI scanners and a PET/CT scanner.

The mobile fleet now comprises seven mobile MRI scanners, a mobile PET/CT scanner and nine mobile CT scanners, which travel around the whole of the UK.



Cobalt continues to invest fundraised money and any surplus created by delivering its services in projects which make a tangible difference to patients, through advancements in imaging technology, research trials and supporting education for medical professionals.

Volunteers at our heart, from the start!

In the early days the charity was run purely by volunteers. Two of the founders, Dr Hanna and Howard Crooks attended fundraising events in their spare time, and Ivy Doughty took care of all the admin work for the fledgling charity. Today, Cobalt employs 146 staff, 100 of whom work at Linton House, with the rest staffing the mobile scanners. We are proud to have kept true to our origins, with volunteers being just as integral to Cobalt as they were in the beginning. We have over 150 amazing volunteers whose dedication and loyalty continue to impress us every day.

Cobalt cards is our largest volunteer-led project and started as one of the first green recycling schemes in the 1980s,

very many years before kerbside recycling was available. Many of our volunteer card-makers have been recycling cards for decades, and last year the project raised over £32.000.

Volunteers help in our busy fundraising office every day. They deliver cards and collect money from around the county. They bake, knit, proofread and help run our open gardens and other events - a huge amount of donated hours without which Cobalt would not be where it is today.

AN INTERVIEW WITH KAREN HACKLING-SEARLE


Director of Clinical Operations

Karen has been working for Cobalt for 30 years and has recently been promoted as Director of Clinical Operations. She is now responsible for all aspects of the charity's clinical services, including the imaging centres in Cheltenham, Birmingham and Gloucester and the mobile/relocatable MRI, CT and PET/CT units that support NHS services around the UK.

We asked Karen about her career at Cobalt. She said "What I originally wanted to do was forensic science, however in the careers office I found information about radiography and became interested in the idea of being able to look inside people's bodies, study their anatomy and identify disease."

She went on to tell us about the changes she had experienced in the industry in the past 30 years.

"There have been continuous technological advances in equipment and software, such as increasing magnet strengths in MRI, enabling fine-detailed imaging of certain body parts and the ability to scan patients more quickly. Patient comfort is a huge development area, with the introduction of features like ambient lighting and 'in-bore' entertainment for patients during their scan, reducing anxiety and helping patients with claustrophobia to gotthrough with their appointment."




Karen told us that one of her career highlights to date was project managing the build of our Imaging Centre in Birmingham. This imaging centre supports research for the Institute of Translational Medicine, which is a central hub for clinical trials and research data, aiming to turn the information into innovative patient treatments. Karen was involved in the design of both the scanner and the modular building which houses it. She is very excited about the research made possible by this collaboration with some of the UK's leading clinicians.

So what does the future hold for medical imaging? Karen said:

"We are currently the largest provider of lowdose CT for targeted lung health checks in several locations where the prevalence of lung cancer is highest and this has proven to be very successful, identifying cancer in smokers and ex-smokers at a more treatable stage, both saving lives and saving the NHS money in the long term. Within the next five years I believe we will be involved in cardiac MRI and CT scanning services and wider screening programmes, such as prostate cancer."

April is our Make A Will Month

During April, our partner solicitors are donating their expertise and time to support Cobalt. Through the scheme they will write or update a straightforward will, in return for a voluntary donation to Cobalt. The suggested minimum donation to Cobalt is £150 for a single will and £200 for joint mirror wills.

The Make a Will Month scheme was launched by Cobalt over thirteen years ago. To date, more than 950 wills have been drafted by our partner solicitors, raising over £120,000 of charitable funding. Whilst there is no obligation to include a gift to Cobalt in a will made through this scheme, gifts in wills provide a vital source of income to Cobalt. After taking care of family and friends, even a

small amount can make a big difference. By remembering Cobalt in your will, you will be helping to ensure that we are able to continue to provide life-changing services and equipment for future generations.

Cobalt supporter Lynne shares why she chose to include a gift to Cobalt in her will:

PATIENT STORIES

Rosemary Westgate

Rosemary started her journey with Cobalt at Linton House, Cheltenham in the Summer of 2012 when she was diagnosed with breast cancer. She recalls that attending her first appointment was a bit of a traumatic experience but that she was welcomed with friendliness. compassion and professionalism.

She said "To date I have had eighteen PET/CT scans, annual checks after my original treatment, then after six years on one scan it showed I had developed secondaries. Again, treatment followed by scans to monitor progress. Unfortunately, in 2019 the scan indicated I needed further treatment.

Then along came Covid with lockdown, temperature checks on entry, masks and social distancing. A difficult time for everyone. I was having scans every

has continued up to the present day, Having originally been scared of during the scans as the room is so cold for the benefit of the machine, the mobile van outside, the welcome hot drink afterwards but most of all the friendship [with] staff [which] has developed over the years."
